

Select Major Religious Observances in Academic Year 2022-23 (August 2022 to July 2023)

Members of the Emory University community observe many diverse religious holidays. Below are the dates of select major Hindu, Jewish, Christian, and Muslim holidays that will occur over the academic year. OSRL provides this list in order to help prevent scheduling conflicts that could impact large populations in the campus community. There are many more religious traditions and holidays observed than are listed here. According to policy, students should work with their faculty members as early as possible to arrange reasonable accommodations for their particular religious observances. Academic deans, ORSL, and the Office of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion are also available for consultation.

| Christmas | Christianity | December 25, 2022 |
| Christmas | Orthodox Christianity | January 7, 2023 |
| Ash Wednesday | Christianity | February 22, 2023 |
| Great Lent Begins | Orthodox Christianity | February 27, 2023 |
| Purim | Judaism | Eve March 6 through day March 7, 2023 |
| Holi | Hinduism | March 8, 2023 |
| Ramadan | Islam | Eve March 22 through day April 20, 2023 |
| Passover, first two days | Judaism | Eve April 5 through April 6, 2023 after nightfall |
| Good Friday | Christianity | April 7, 2023 |
| Easter | Christianity | April 9, 2023 |
| Passover, last two days | Judaism | Eve April 12 through April 13, 2023 after nightfall |
| Holy Friday | Orthodox Christianity | April 14, 2023 |
| Orthodox Easter | Orthodox Christianity | April 16, 2023 |
| Eid al-Fitr | Islam | Eve April 21 through day April 22, 2023 |
| Shavuot | Judaism | Eve May 25 through May 27, 2023 after nightfall |
| Eid al-Adha | Islam | Eve June 28 through day June 29, 2023 |

Muslim holidays are based on a lunar calendar, and the actual dates are determined by direct observation of the moon as announced by the mosque. Christian holidays also begin on the eve of the dates listed.
